What happened in the end?





Result

End with the results of your efforts, including accomplishments, rewards, and impact



Introduce the

situation to the

employer and set

the context

Describe the task you had to complete, including the expectations and challenges it would involve

Action

Explain what you did, and how you did it

Dress

Dress :one notch above what the company's typical attire is.


Shoes

Shoes: Put your work shoes on - an important psychological effect

Color

Wear solid colors, as stripes/complex patterns can look odd

Don't show clutter





A blank background - not clashing with your shirt

Some other checks




A copy of your resume
