While Putting together your strengths:

Self	It's important to be yourself
Stick	Stick to the same strengths irrespective of the occasion
Avoid	Avoid talking about examples
Focus	Focus on 1 or 2 strengths only
Link	Link your Skills to the role
Pick	Pick the Top 3
Think	Think of examples for each of these skills

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Talk about job titles that you want to get in the next two to three, or five years, 2


Focus on what you would like to achieve & accomplish

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Avoid adding any longer-term goals

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What are your salary expectations

- You risk your complete effort in the interview
- You risk selling yourself short
- Avoid answering too early in the interview process
- Try avoiding a direct answer till they have seen your 'value'



Your aim during the interview process

Typical mindset

"What is the minimum salary to hire this person?

Your aim

"What salary should we offer to convince this person to join us?"

What are your salary expectations Possible answer for fresher

"I am starting my career, and the experience is more important

I look forward to building my career

I prefer working in your organization because (brand, experience, industry ...)

The role & career path are more important to me

A package in line with others who have the same qualifications





Research the market and salary trends

Give a range, not a number



Turn the question around



Emphasis your interest in the position and responsibilities

TOUGHJOB INTERVIEW QUESTIONS



Tough job interview questions -purpose

- Gives the interviewer a deeper sense of who you are
- Check your fit with the company/ role
- Could depend on the profile of the interviewer
- To easily filter through a large number ofn candidates

Tips for Tough interview questions



Use the "STAR" answering technique



Provide examples & anecdotes from your experience to highlight your point



Highlight the positives & learnings from any negative experience

Personality Questions

Linked to your failures

Linked to your mistakes /weaknesses

What do people most criticize you about?

Why have you been out of work?

Replying to questions linked to failures



Highlight you how responded to failure



Point out that anyone may fail at some point of time



Show what you learned from it



Give an example of building on it to do better in the future

Questions linked to 'stress'



Can be a "trick question" to make you reveal critical flaws



Be careful not to provide too much negative information



Clarify with an example



Highlight your approach for success

Why have you not been placed / not have a job?



Be positive, honest and brief



Eliminate personal issues (lack of ambition, laziness, or a poor work ethic).



Point out any circumstances beyond the individual's control.



Highlight other interim activities – projects, volunteering, research, higher study plans

✓ Highlight the actions that did not match up to the requirement

Result

✓ Acknowledge the results

✓ Highlight the lesson
